**ORDER**

In the G.O. read above, orders were issued allocating the work among the Chief Conservator of Forests. Subsequently in G.O.(Rt) No.5304/82/GAD dated 10.08.1982, the cadre post of Additional Chief Conservator of Forests was revived with effect from 12.05.1982 and the ex-cadre post of Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) was redesignated as Chief Conservator of Forests (Social Forestry). It was also, *inter-alia*, ordered therein that the Additional Chief Conservator of Forests would be in charge of Wildlife and Management of Sanctuaries and the Chief Conservator of Forests (Social Forestry) would be in charge of Social Forestry and Project preparation connected therewith. Accordingly, the work between the Chief Conservator of Forests (Social Forestry) and Additional Chief Conservator of Forests is reallocated as shown below:-

**Chief Conservator of Forests (Social Forestry)**

Social Forestry, Project preparation connected therewith, Forest Publicity, Exhibition and Library and Museum.

**Additional Chief Conservator of Forests**

Wildlife and Management of Sanctuaries

All the Chief Conservator of Forests and the Additional Chief Conservator of Forests shall meet every week on a fixed day for purposes of greater coordination between the different wings. The Committee of Chief Conservator of Forests should function like the Board of Revenue. In the weekly meetings there should be regular

agenda which may include items of importance that officers of other wing should know and there should be discussions on matters affecting all the wings like transfer and senior officers and other proposals. The junior most Chief Conservator of Forests could maintain the minutes of the weekly meetings.

3. The Vigilance Wing should be housed separately from other wings of the Forest Department, so that all papers of the Vigilance Wing are not seen by staff of other sections.
4. The G.O. read above will stand modified to this extent.
