The above said candidates were deputed for the Eighteen month Forest Range Officer Training Certificate Course at Tamil Nadu Forest Academy, Coimbatore as per the letter read as 2nd above. The above 13 candidates joined the Forest Range Officers course 2015-17 commenced from 23rd November 2015 at Tamil Nadu Forest Academy Coimbatore. In the letter read as third

above, the Director, Tamil Nadu Forest Academy, Coimbatore intimated that all the trainees except Sri. Arun Visa have successfully completed the Eighteen month Forest Range Officer training Certificate Course. In the case of Sri. Arun Visa he has completed all the requirements for the course except East India Tours which he will complete with the succeeding batch.

As per Rule 9 (f) of Kerala Forest Service Special Rules, 2010 the Range Forest Officers appointed by direct recruitment under item (i) (a) under category 3 of Rule 3, on satisfactory completion of training in the Forest Rangers College shall undergo practical training in the forest department for a period of one year. During of period of Rangers Training in the Forest College and the period of practical training in the department the candidate shall be paid basic pay and other admissible allowances. The period spent for training in the Forest College and practical training in the department shall be counted for pension and leave. 
availing actual journey time. During the period of their training, the Ranger Forest Officer trainees will be under the control and supervision of the Divisional Forest Officers concerned. During the practical training, the Range Forest Officer trainees will be paid basic pay and other admissible allowances due, from the office of the Divisional Forest officer of the Forest Range to which the Range Forest Officer trainees are attached for practical training.

The Divisional Forest officers concerned shall take appropriate decision for conducting the training as scheduled. After completion of practical training the trainees shall be relieved with direction to report before the undersigned.

After each lap of training the Range Forest Officer trainees will prepare a detailed report covering the various aspects of their training and submit to the Divisional Forest Officer who in turn will forward the same to the Chief Conservator of Forests /Conservator of Forests (territorial) with remarks. The Chief Conservator of Forests will furnish half yearly and annual assessment report of work and conduct of the Range Forest Officer trainees to the Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Administration).
