

## **KALLUR RESERVED FOREST**

### **NOTIFICATION**

**Fort St. George, May 1<sup>st</sup> 1939.**

No. 374:—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (4) of section 17-A of the Madras Forest Act 1882 (Madras V of 1882) His Excellency the Governor of Madras is hereby pleased to redefine the limits of Kallur Reserved Forest, Wynad taluk, Malabar district, so as to remove the defects in the description of the limits of the said forests in Revenue Department Notification No. 58, dated 28<sup>th</sup> November 1895, published at page 146 of Part I of the Fort. St. George Gazette, dated 4th February 1896, by making the following corrections to the limits of the said forest.

#### **Correction**

For the schedule to the said notification, the following schedule shall be substituted; namely:

#### **Schedule**

Malabar District—Wynaad taluk—Nulpuzha amsom and desom

(Name of Forest: Kallur-Area in acres 2,077.29)

#### **Description of Boundaries**

*North* —Starting from the south west corner of survey No.184, the boundary line runs along the south sides of survey No.184, the south and east sides of survey No.182, the east side of survey No.181, the south sides of survey No. I (Rampur Reserved Forest) the south side of survey No.178, the west, south and east sides of survey No. 168, the south, east and north sides of survey No.169, the east and north sides of survey No.178 (again) the east side of survey No. 173, the south and east sides of survey No.170, the south side of survey No. 1 again (Rampur Reserved Forest) to the westernmost corner of survey No.99.

*East.*—Thence the west and south sides of survey No.99, the south sides of survey No.100, the west sides of survey Nos.94, 93, 89, 88, 89 (again) 87, 85 and 84 to the northern most corner of survey No.83, (trijunction of survey Nos. 84, 83 and 82) thence the north, west and south sides of survey No.83, the west sides of survey Nos.82, 81, 80, 54-1 and 53 to the northernmost corner of survey No.50, thence its west side and the north side of survey No.49, to the north-west corner of the last mentioned field.

*South.*—Thence the north sides of survey Nos.102, 103 and 104 the east, north and west sides of survey No.116, the east and north sides of survey No. 117 the north and west sides of survey No.118, the north side of survey No. 119, the east and north sides of survey No.125, the north sides of survey Nos. 126 and 127, the east and north sides of survey No.132, the east, north and West sides of survey No.133, the north and west sides of survey No.134, the north sides of survey Nos.138 and 139, the north and west sides of survey Nos.143 and 145, the north sides of survey No.148,

the east sides of survey No.156, the east and north sides of survey No.157, the north side of survey No. 156 again the north and west sides of survey No.158, the north sides of survey Nos.159, 161 and 162, the north and west sides of survey No.163, to the Sultans Battery-Gundelpet road thence westwards along the northern margin of the said road (north side of survey No.230) to the south-east corner of survey No.164, thence its east north and west sides to its south-west corner on the Sultans Battery-Gundelpet road again; thence the northern margin of that road (north sides of survey Nos. 230, 229, 228, 227, 226, 225, 224, 223 and 222) to the south-east corner of survey No. 220-I.B.

*West.*—Thence the eastern sides of survey Nos.220-IB, 218 and 216 to the (trijunction of survey Nos.216, 199 and 198) thence the south sides of survey Nos.198 and 197, the south and east side of survey Nos.196 and 195, the south sides of survey Nos.194 and 193 the west, south and east sides of survey No. 219, the east sides of survey Nos.193 again 192, 190 and 189 and 188 and the southern boundary of survey No.1 (Rampur Reserved Forests) to the starting point;

The Reserve comprises the following survey Nos. 220-IC., 180,179, 167 and 101-I.

*Remarks.*—I. The following are admitted as enclosures within the reserve:—

- (1) Survey No. 101-2 of Nulpuzha desom 1.00 acre (temple).
- (2) Survey No. 166 of Nulpuzha desom 4.69 acres.
- (3) Survey No. 165 of Nulpuzha desom 1.10

acres.

II. The following rights of way are allowed:

- (1) A path for which there is no local name is opened to men only. It is 10 yards wide and 5 chains long. It enters the reserve on the eastern boundary at a point  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains north of the south-west corner of survey No.85 of Nulpuzha desom and runs generally in a south-western direction and leaves the reserve on the eastern side of the enclosure No.I (Survey No. 101-2) at a point one chain south of the north-east corner of survey No. 101-2 of Nulpuzha desom.
- (2) A path for which there is no local name, is 10 yards wide and is opened to men and cattle only. It enters the reserve on the north boundary at the south-west corner of survey No.178 of Nulpuzha desom and runs generally in a southerly direction for 12 chains and leaves the reserve at the north-east corner of the enclosure No. II (Survey No.166) at a point 4 chains east of the northern most point of Survey No.166. It re-enters the reserve at the south-east corner of survey No.166 and runs generally in a south-easterly direction for 21 chains and leaves the reserve at the North West corner of survey No.165 (enclosure No. III). It again re-enters the reserve at the

south east corner of survey No.165 and runs generally in a southerly direction for 108 chains and leaves the reserves on its south boundary at a point 40 links east of the north-west corner of survey No.158 (the total length of the path within the reserved forest is 136 chains or 1 mile 5 furlongs and 6 chains).

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
