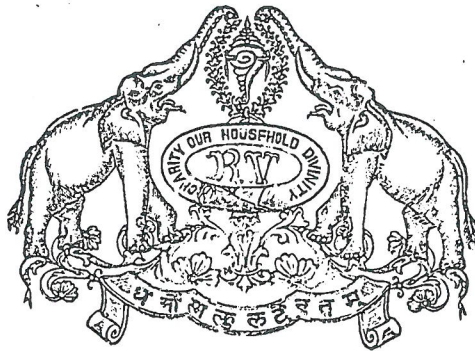

Whereas an emergency has arisen which makes it expedient to prohibit the landing at, or embarking from, the ports within Travancore, of persons without passports: We are pleased to command as follows:—

1. This Proclamation shall be called the Travancore Passport Proclamation, 1092.

Manimala and Kanjirapalli.	<p><i>Situation.</i>—This Reserve is situated just to the east of Manimala-Ranni road and to the south of Karikkattur Yermali foot path from Thoongapala and comprises S. No. 115/1 the major portion of S. Nos. 112/1, 114/1 and 116/1, a small portion of S. No. 75/1 of Manimala village, the major portion of S. No. 372/1 and a small portion of S. No. 357/1 of Kanjirapalli village, Peermade taluk.</p> <p><i>North.</i>—Starting from cairn No. 1 situated south of the foot path from Karikkattur to Yermali, near Thoongapala and about 2½ chains west of Kandam stone, at the south-east corner of S. No. 75/1 of Manimala pakuthy the line runs south-east for about 2½ chains to cairn No. 2, thence south south-east for about 6½ chains to cairn No. 3 on a village boundary stone thence more or less south-east for about 23 chains along the village boundary between the Kanjirapalli and Manimala and passing cairn Nos. 4 to 12 to cairn No. 13 at the village boundary stone south of the foot path mentioned above; thence more or less in the same direction for about 31½ chains along the south side of the footpath from Karikkattoor to Yermali crossing Thoongapala Thodu and the estate road from Ranni-Manimala road to Cheruvalli estate and passing cairn Nos. 14 to 19 to cairn No. 20 at a sharp bend of the footpath; thence more or less north-east for about 62 chains along the south side of the footpath passing cairn Nos. 21 to 36 to cairn No. 37; thence east for about 5½ chains to meet the village boundary stone at the footpath on the southern side of S. I. Private rights within the Reserve.

There are no such rights admitted within the Reserve by the Forest Settlement Officer

II. Public rights within the Reserve.

(1) *Right of way.* There is a right of way over a road from Cheruvalli Estate to the Manimala Ranni road passing through the reserve and constructed at the expense of the Estate Proprietors, as per agreement entered into by them with the Government.

Description of the road is as follows:—

The road within the Reserve is 78 chains, 84 links long and 18 ft. wide. This road enters the reserve on the northern boundary between cairn Nos 17 and 18 about 6 chains south-east of the former cairn and runs in a south westerly direction for about $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains thence in a southerly direction for about $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains; thence south-west for about 8 chains and thence in a south south westerly direction for about $54\frac{1}{2}$ chains and thence westward for about $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains to meet the southern boundary of the reserve at about 2 chains north west of cairn No. 202 and thence leaves the Reserve.

III. *Right to water-course.*

There are no such rights within the Reserve.
