

RESERVE NOTIFICATIONS

Wayanad Wildlife Sanctuary consists of the following Reserve Forests.

1. Kallur RF, 2. Noolpuzha RF, 3. Mavinhalla R.F, 4. Rampur R.F, 5. Edathara R.F, 6. Kurichiyat R.F, 7. Kuppadi R.F, 8. Alathur R.F, 9. Begur R.F, 10. Kattikulam R.F, 11. Nemminad RF, 12. Elacode RF and 13. Kudrokote R.F.

KUPPADI RESERVED FOREST

(Fort St. George, July 2, 1941)

No.485. – In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (4) of section 17-A of the Madras Forest Act, 1882 (Madras Act V of 1882). His Excellency the Governor of Madras is hereby pleased to redefine the limits of Kuppadi Reserved Forest, Wynaad Taluk, Malabar District, so as to remove the defects in the description of the limits of the said forest in Revenue Department Notification No. 112, dated 31st March 1885, published at pages 272 to 274 of Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated the 21st April, 1885, by making the following corrections to the limits of the said forest.

Corrections

For the schedule to the said notification, the following schedule shall be substituted, namely:-

Schedule

Malabar District, Wynaad taluk, Kidanganad amsom, Chenad, Vadakkanad and Kidanganad desom.

(Name of Forest. – Kuppadi; Area – 7916.48 acres)

Description of Boundaries

North: Starting from the south-west corner of survey No. 1 of Chenad desom (Kurichiat Reserved Forest) the boundary line runs eastwards along the south sides of the said survey number to the north-west corner of survey No.48, the west side of survey No. 48 to the trijunction of survey No. 48, 73 and 74; thence the west and south sides of survey No. 74, south side of survey No.75, west sides of survey Nos. 76 and 81, the west sides of survey Nos. 94, 92 and 89, the south sides of survey No.88, 84, 48, 42, 41 and 40, the west side of survey No.37, the west, south and east sides of survey No.35, the east sides of survey Nos.37, 31 and 3, the south sides of survey Nos.2, 1 (the above survey Numbers are all of Chenad desom) and 149-I of Vadakkanad desom (Kurichiat Reserved forest) to the northernmost corner of survey No.2; thence the west side of survey Nos.2 and 8 to the trijunction of

survey Nos.8, 17 and 18, thence the north sides of survey No.18, east, north and west sides of survey No.25, the north sides of survey No.27, the east sides of survey No.29, south, east and north sides of survey No. 31, east and north sides of survey No. 33, west sides of survey Nos.35 and 37,west and south sides of survey No.39, south and east sides of survey No.40, east sides of survey No.37, west, south and east side of survey No.41, south sides of survey No.42, 49 and 50, the west side of survey No.55, I-51, I-B, 63-2 and 61-I.G., the west, south and east sides of survey No.65, south sides of survey No.66, 69 and 70, the west, south and east sides of survey No.71, east side of survey No.73, south and east sides of survey No.71, east side of survey No.73, south, east and north sides of survey No.72, east side of survey No.73, again the south side of Survey No.81 to the south – west corner of survey No.82 (trijunction of survey Nos.81, 82 and 97-2), thence the south sides of survey No.97-2 (lying between survey Nos. 821 and 96) the south sides of survey Nos. 96 and 97-2, again (lying between survey Nos.96 and 99) west sides of survey Nos. 99, 100, 101 and 1-2 to the desom boundary between Vadakkanad and Nulpuzha desoms (all the above survey numbers are of Vadakkanad desom).

East:- Thence the said desom boundary to the trijunction of Vadakkanad, Kidanganad and Nulpuzha desoms, thence south-westwards along the boundary between Kidanganad and Nulpuzha desoms to the north-east corner of survey No.61 of Kidanganad desom, thence the north side of survey No.61, east side of survey Nos.60, 59 and 58, east and north sides of survey No.57, north side of survey No.55, east and north side of survey No.54, north, west and south sides of survey No.53, north sides of survey Nos.52, 51, 50, 49, 48 and 47, east side of survey Nos.45 and 44, east, north and west sides of survey No.43, west side of survey No.44, north side of survey No.45, to the trijunction of survey Nos. 45, 42 and 29, thence the north sides of survey No.29, east and north sides of survey No. 19, east, north and west sides of survey No.18, west sides of survey Nos. 17 and 16, north and west sides of survey No.15 and the west side of survey No.14, the north sides of survey No.13, east, north and west sides of survey No.12 and the north and west sides of survey No.2, to the north-east corner of survey No.208 (crossing the Sultans Battery Chedleth Forest road).

South: Thence the north sides of survey Nos. 208, 210, 211, 214, 253, ½ 290 and 292, the east and north sides of survey No.293, north side of survey No.292, again, east and north sides of survey No.294, north sides of survey Nos.295 and 296, east and north sides of survey No.297, north sides of survey No.302, east sides of survey Nos.303 and 304, east and north sides of survey No.305, east, north and west sides of survey No.315, north sides of survey Nos.319 and 325, and the east sides of survey Nos.324 and 320 to the north-eastern corner of the last mentioned held on the Pudadi desom boundary.

West: Thence the Pudadi desom boundary to the starting point.

NOTE: The reserve comprises the whole of survey Nos.95, 36, 34, 33 and 32 of Chenad desom. 1/1 of the Kidanganad and 1/1, 61/1A and 63/1 of Vadakkanad desom.

Remarks: A The following rights of way are admitted in this reserve:-

- (1). The Chedaletth Sultans Battery road is open to people and cattle. It is 10 yards wide, and 5 miles 3 furlongs and 5 chains in length. It enters the reserve 6 chains east from the south-east corner of survey No.84 of Chenad desom and runs generally in a south-easterly direction for 2 miles, 2 furlongs and 6 chains and thence in a southerly direction for 3 miles and 9 chains to the south-east corner of the reserve where it leaves the reserved forest boundary.
 - (2). A path (for which there is no local name) is open to people and cattle. It is 10 yards wide and 1 mile 1 furlong in length. It enters the reserve 2 ½ chains west from the northern most corner of survey No.55/1 and runs generally in a south-westerly direction and joins the Sultan Battery – Chedleth road (Right of way No.1) at a point 10 ½ chains north from the northernmost point of survey No.2 of Kidanganad desom.
 - (3). The Panamaram-Chedleth road is open to people and cattle. It is 10 yards wide and 32 chains in length. It enters the reserve chains north-east from the north-west corner of the reserve and runs generally in an easterly direction to a point on the northern boundary of the reserve 12 ½ chains north-east from the western most corner of survey No.48 of Chenad desom.
- B. The Jain and Bet Kurumbas residing in this reserved forest are permitted to continue therein and to enjoy their present privileges until they have been provided for elsewhere. Meantime, they will be tenants at will of the Forest Department.
