No. 1V one and a half furlongs to cairn No.10 and north-east by east about three hundred and twenty yards to Tranni gudde (cairn No.....11) ; thence north by west about two hundred and ninety yards to Bellipadi mudu gudde (cairn no.12) ; thence east by south about two hundred and sixty yards to Cairn No. 13; thence south east by south about one hundred and thirty yards to Kalari gudde (Cairn No. 14) ; thence in the same direction crossing P. R. W. No.V about three hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 15

; and north – east about one hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 16; and east by south about three hundred yards to cairn No. 17 ; thence north about one hundred and forty yards to Panjurli mattah motte ( cairn No. 18 ); thence east about one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 20; thence east by north for about two hundred and eighty yards to Cairns no.19; thence south east about one hundred and sixty yards to Aravankallu motta ( cairn No. 21); south-south-east crossing P. R. W. No. VI about two hundred and eighty yards to Muchoorpalla motte (cairn No.34); thence west by south about one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 35; thence west-north-west for about five hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 36 and on in the same direction for about one hundred fifty yards to cairn No. 37; thence south-west crossing P. R. W. No. XXV three hundred yards to cairn No. 38 and passing along the south side of Kudukoli cultivation (Muliwarg No. 4 of Muliar) east south-east three hundred and eighty yards to cairn No.39 and south east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 40; thence skirting the Baja cultivation of the

same warg, west slightly south two hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No.41; west-north-west the same distance to cairn No.42; south-west crossing P. R. W. No. XXI one hundred and seventy five yards to cairn No. 43, south-east three hundred yards to cairn No.44, south slightly east two hundred yards to cairn No. 45 at the head of the Area garden belonging to that warg; thence east-north-east three hundred yards to cairn No.46 and on for two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 47; thence south-east crossing P. R. W. No. VII one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 48 to the south of Narikala Tota of the same warg; thence north-east two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 49 thence east for about four hundred and eighty yards to Natekallu Motte (cairn No.50); thence south-east for about three hundred yards to cairn No.51 and in the same direction crossing P. R. W. No. VIII about four hundred and forty yards to Paishwani river (cairn No.52); thence the river for about three hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 53; thence west-south-west again crossing P. R. W. No. VIII about three hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 54 and from there east by south for about two hundred and sixty yards to Cairn No. 55; thence south for about to hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 56 ; and south-west crossing P. R. W. No. IX for about two hundred yards to the right bank of the Paishwani river (cairn No. 57).

No. X to cairn No. 61 and on for about four hundred yards to cairn No. 62 ; thence north slightly west for one furlong to cairn No.63; then passing along the north side of Mundakadu and Miniangala cultivation south-west one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 64; south slightly more west crossing P. R. W. No. VII two hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 65; and on for about three hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 66 and west about two hundred and thirty yards to Ballad motte (cairn No.67) and north-west for about one hundred and forty yards to Balal gудde (cairn No.68); thence north-north-east for

about one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No.69; thence east-north-east about two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 70; thence west-north-west about two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No.71 and west-south-west one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 72 west by south crossing P. R. W. No. XXVI about one hundred and forty yards to Kuttiadka gudde (cairn No. 73), and on for about two hundred and fifty yards to Pulingatadka gudde (cairn No 74); thence south by west for about two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 75 and west by south- crossing P. R. W. No. XX for a bout two hundred sixty yards to Mugali gudde (cairn No. 76) and south-south-east crossing P. R. W. No. XIII about two hundred and thirty yards to Kuniarinadu gudde (cairn No.77); thence east by north for about three hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 79 and east by north for about three hundred and twenty yards to Ealladka gudde (cairn No.80); thence south-south-east two hundred yards to Kolambenadu gudde (cairn No.81) and south for about one hundred and forty yards to Kolambeadka cairn No. 82); thence west-south-west one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 82  $\frac{3}{4}$  A, south-east crossing P. R. W. No. XI one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 83; thence west ward along the right bank of the Paishwani river some three furlong to cairn No. 84; one hundred yards east of Kolikaya cultivation (Muliwarg No.53 of Muliyar); thence excluding that cultivation north one hundred and sixty five yards crossing P. R. W. No. XI to cairn No. 84-A, west two hundred and thirty-three yards to cairn No. 85 and south-south west crossing P. R. W. No. XII one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 86 back to the right bank of the same river one hundred yards west of the above- mention cultivation; thence again the river bank west ward for about one furlong to cairn No. 87; one hundred yards east of the Chettetodu cultivation (Muliwarg No.53 of Muliar); thence passing round the east, north and west sides of that cultivation Muglimule and Padumundaikadu cultivation of the same warg north slightly west again crossing P. R. W. No. XII one fourth mile to cairn No. 86 and on in the same direction one furlong to cairn No. 88-A thence north-west crossing PRW No. XVIII one hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 89 and south-west the same distance to cairn No. 90 crossing P. R. W. Nos. XVIII and XIX; thence south-east two hundred and seventy-five yards to

cairn No. 91, south-south-west two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 92 on Chettetodupadu gudde; thence south slightly east again crossing P. R. W. No. XIII two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 93 on the right bank of the river one hundred yards west of Chattetodu cultivation thence the river for about three furlong to cairn No. 94; then west by south crossing P. R. W. No. XIII about hundred and fifty yards to Yelanjiadka gudde (Cairn No.95); thence west-north-west about two hundred and forty yards to Arrikkochi (cairn No. 96) and north-north-west about four hundred yards to cairn No. 97; thence west by south crossing P. R. W. No. XIV about two hundred and seventy yards to the Paishwani river (cairn No.98); thence the river for about two hundred yards to cairn No. 99; then north-north-east crossing P. R. W. No. XIV about two hundred and sixty yards to a totty (cairn No.100) and north-west for about one hundred and fifty yards to Kuttiana gudde (cairn No. 101) and thence west by south about one hundred and ninety yards crossing P. R. W. Nos. XVII and XV to the river (cairn No.102) and thence the river for about one hundred and ten yards to cairn no.103.

**West:**-Thence turning north-west, crossing P. R. W. No.XV about one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 104, and east-north-east about two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 105, north-north-West crossing P. R. W. No. XVI, about one hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 106, and West by south about four hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 107 and due west for about four hundred yards to small motte (cairn No. 108) and north-west about one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 109; and thence north-north-west about one hundred and fifty yards to a Bore motte (cairn No. 110) and continuing in the same direction for about one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 111, from there east-north-east for about four hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 112; and east about one hundred and ten yards to cairn no. 113; thence turning north-east for about one hundred and ten yards, to Sonipalla motte (cairn No. 114); thence east by south about four hundred and twenty yards to Ichepare (cairn No. 115), and south-east about one hundred and twenty yards to (cairn No. 116); and east-north-east about one

hundred and twenty yards to Ponnikkala Kavoo motte (cairn No. 117); thence turning south-east about two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 118; thence south by west about one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 119 thence south-west about one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 120 thence south-south-east crossing the P. R. W. Nos. XVI and XVII, one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 121 and east by south about two hundred and twenty yards to a motte (cairn No.122); then south-east about one hundred and ten yards to (cairn No.123); and thence in the same direction for about one hundred and fifty yards to Palekalmuli (cairn No.124); and thence east-north-east about two hundred and twenty yards to Paletottyadka (cairn No.125) thence north-north-east crossing P. R. W. No. XVIII about four hundred and twenty yards to Mudupilapare (cairn No.126); then west-north-west about two hundred yards to Ambllamotte cairn No. 127); and south by west for about one hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 128; and west by north about one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 129; and north by west for about one hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 130; thence north-north-west about one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 131; and north by east about one hundred sixty yards to cairn No. 132; and south-east about one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 133; and north-north-east about two hundred yards to Kuliakunnu (cairn no. 134); thence east by north crossing P. R. W. No. XIX about one hundred and fifty yards to Muniangodugudde (cairn No.135); and thence south-east about three and forty yards to cairn No. 136; and east by north about two hundred yards to cairn No. 137; then north-east for fifty yards to cairn no. 137-A; thence north-west crossing P.R I. W. No. XX about one hundred and ten yards to Manian gude nadu gudde (cairn No. 138); and thence east by north about two hundred and ninety yards to cairn No.139, and north-east about three hundred and seventy yards to Tenekambare Bedagudde (cairn No. 140); thence skirting the Minangadde and Puvalumule Cultivations of muli warg No. 4 of Muliyar village on the north side, west north-west four hundred yards to cairn No. 140-A and on for two hundred and fifty yards to (cairn No. 141); nearly due west two hundred yards to cairn No. 142; then towards Jadikalmule north slightly west crossing P. R. W. No. XXI, two hundred and twenty yards slightly west crossing P. R. W. No.

XXI two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 143; west-north-west one hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn Mp- 144 Rs ..north slightly east one hundred yards to cairn No. 145; north east the same distance to cairn No. 145-A, north slightly north east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 146 north- west one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 147; and on in the same direction crossing P. R. W. No. XXII two hundred yards to cairn No. 148 to the north east of Jadikalmule (muli warg No.65 of Mulliar); thence west-south-west and eighty yards to cairn No. 149 and south-south-east three hundred and fifteen yards to cairn No. 150 to the north of Navothungalmule; thence west-north-west two hundred yards to cairn No. 151; south-south-east two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 152 on Pardale Motte, south-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 153 on Kundupila motte; thence south slightly west two hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 154 to the north of Ambalmule cultivation; thence west-south-west three hundred and forty; five yards to cairn No. 155; then west-north-west crossing P. R. W. No. III one hundred and ten yards to cairn no.156 and again west-south-west one hundred and twenty five yards to cairn No. 157; thence passing north slightly east over a hill for two furlongs to cairn No. 164 on chedaknedadka to the south-east of the eastern arm of muli warg No. 26 of Muliar; thence north-north-west crossing P. R. W. No. XXIII two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 165; to the north-east of the same warg; thence west-south-west one furlong to cairn No. 166; then passing round the darkhast lands of muli warg No. 141 of Muliar and Beltamule of muli warg No. 26 of the same village; north-north-east two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 166-A, north-slightly east two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 166-B, west-north-west the same distance to cairn No. 166-C, and south-west three hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 167; then passing round Vombemule cultivation north-north-west two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 168, north-west crossing P. R. W. No. – II one hundred and twenty – five yards to cairn No. 168-A, south-west seventy yards to cairn No. 169 south slightly east three hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 170 and south-south-east one hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 171; thence west for about four-hundred and ten yards to Lingana mule (cairn No. 172); and thence

south-south-west about two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 173; thence west-north-west crossing P.R.W. No. XXIV about three hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 174 and north-north-west one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 175 and north by west for about three hundred and ninety yards to a pare (cairn No. 176); thence west by north for about four hundred yards to cairn No. 177 RS and thence north-north-west about six hundred and ten yards to the starting point.

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Remarks --- A. The followings are demarcated out as enclosures within the reserve the reserve themselves free from reservation, rights of way thereto being as shown below :

- I. Hiriuannadka darkhast muli wargs Nos. 57 and 124 of Muliar Village, demarcated out by four cairns right of way thereto being by P.R.W. Nos. I, IV, V, XXI, XXV and XXVI below.
  - II. The portion of muli warg No. 68 of Muliar, area 59 cents, lying to the east of the line between cairns No. 58 and 59 and about one hundred and twenty yards south-east of the latter cairns, demarcated out with kumaki therefor by four cairns, right of way thereto being by P.R.W., No. X below :
- B. The following Bhutastans or shrine easements are admitted :

Easement Nos. 1 and 2 – Permission is accorded to members of Nair and Tiayar castes to perform worship at two Bhutastans within the reserve. The first situate one hundred yards south-south-east of cairn No. 4 and on the east side of P.R.W. No. II by which access the Bhutastan is permitted and the second being some three hundred and fifty yards north-north-east of cairn No. 166-B and fifty yards south west of the junction of P.R.W. Nos. I and III, both of which paths serves as access to the Bhutastan. The latter shrine will be open to the public of all castes. These

Bhutastans will not be demarcated out as enclosures within the reserve free from reservation but right to worship thereat by individuals which will consist only for depositing Offerings will be permitting generally throughout the year and a special ceremony may be performed in the month of October yearly at the shrines.

C. The following water easements are admitted within the reserve :

Easement No. 3 – Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of muli warg No. 69 of Mulliar village to repair a dam across the north-eastern end of a tank ten yards within the reserve and two hundred and thirty yards south-east of cairn No. 8. With stones and earth taken from the bed of the tank. The height of the dam will not exceed three feet also to lead of water therefrom by a channel three feet wide, including its banks and ten yards long running north-east from the tank through the reserve. Right of entry into the reserve for the maintenance of the bund and channel will be by the bed of the channel. The easement will be in operation from September to the January following yearly.

Easement No. 4 – permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of muli warg No. 5 of Mulliar Village to deepen a tank of about twenty-five square yards, less than ten yards within the reserve, between cairns Nos. 65 and 66 and to lead off water there from by a channel, three feet wide including its banks, passing through the reserve south-ward for some eight yards and issuing from it one hundred and forty yards west of cairn No. 65; right of entry into the reserve for the deepening of the tank and repair of the channel will be by the bed of the channel and with material taken from within the limits proposed for the beds of each from October to December yearly.

D. The following rights of way through the reserve are provided for the use of the public :....

- I. Kasaragod-Kiriyannadka bandy-track, to a width of ten feet for men, cattle and carts, enters there reserve one furlong east by south of cairn No. 1, passes through it in a generally easterly direction for nearly two miles and quits it fifty yards south of cairn No. 1 of the Hiriyannadka enclosure; continuing as a footpath, four feet wide for men only, it re-enters the reserve twenty yards south of cairn No. 4 of that enclosure, passes east-north-east for half a mile and again leaves it one hundred yards south-east of cairn No. 21; again entering that reserve on the north side of cairn No. 25; it passes east-north-east for some one hundred and hundred and eighty yards and finally quits it twenty yards south of cairn No. 29, proceeding thence to Kannur.
- II. Mular – Vombemule foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle enters the reserve to the west of cairn No. 4, passes through it in a southerly direction for two and a half furlongs and quits it to the east of cairn No. 168-A. This path will be allowed to a width of ten feet for men, cattle and carts from the point of its entrance into the reserve to its junction with P.R.W., No. I.
- III. Mular – Tiadka footpath, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters there reserve forty yards west of cairn No. 6 passes through it south south-east one furlong and then joins the Hiriyannadka bandy-track along which it proceeds for about one hundred and forty yards; then turning southward it passes generally south some seven furlongs and quits the reserve on the west side of cairn No. 155.
- IV. Bellipadi – Kiriyannadka foot-path, to width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve sixty yards north-west of cairn No. 10 passes through it south-south-east one hundred and fifty yards and then joins the Hiriyannadka bandy-track.

- V. Kamankote-Kiryannadka foot-path, to a width of four feet for men only, enters the reserve one hundred yards north-west of cairn No. 15, passes through it south-south-west for one and a half furlongs and quits it two furlongs east of cairn No. 1 of the Hirriyannadka enclosure.
- VI. Koratikundu footpath, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve forty yards west of cairn No. 24, passes through it south-east for nearly two furlongs and quits it on the south side of cairn No. 33.
- VII. Kundukanda – Mundakadu foot-path, to a width of four feet for men only, enters the reserve twenty yards west of cairn No. 48 passes through it south for two hundred and sixty yards and quits on the west side of cairn No. 64.
- VIII. Sudukudu-Chamblangaya foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred and fifty yards west of cairn No. 52, passes through it in a southerly direction two furlongs and quits it fifty yards west of cairn No. 53.
- IX. Miniangala-Chamblangaya foot-path to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 58, passes through it along the north bank of the Paishwani river for seven furlongs and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 57.
- X. Path to a portion of muli warg No. 68 of Muliar, six feet wide for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred yards east of cairn No. 60, passes southward for one and a quarter furlongs and quits it on the north side of the enclosure.
- XI. Kolikaya-Miniangala foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 84, passes through it along the north bank of the Paishwani river some three furlongs and quits it north-west of cairn No. 83.

- XII. Chettetodu-Kolikaya foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 87, passes through it eastward for one furlong and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 86.
- XIII. Ari-Kuniari foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters there reserve on the west side of cairn No. 94, passes through it along the bank of the Paishwani rivers some three furlong and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 93, re-entering the reserve on the south side of cairn No. 88, it passes north-east through the reserve one furlong and finally quits it one hundred and ten yards north of cairn No. 77.
- XIV. Sanna Kuttinna – Ari foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 99 passes south-east ward through it along the bank of the Paishwani river for about one furlong and quits it on the east side of cairn No. 98.
- XV. Dodda Kuttinna – Sanna Kuttinna foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 103; passes through it south-east along the river bank, about one hundred and ten yards and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 102.
- XVI. Tiadka-Dodda Kuttinna foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve at the same point as the Asna Kuttinna path (P.R.W. NO. XVII) below passes through it west – warg for one furlong and quits it one hundred and ten yards south of cairn No. 106.
- XVII. Tiadka-Sanna Kuttinna foot-path to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve fifty yards north of cairn No. 121, passes through it in a generally south-westerly direction for two and a half furlongs and quits it one hundred yards south-west of cairn No. 101.
- XVIII. Tiadka-Balebalapu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve two hundred and fifty yards north-north-east of cairn

No. 125, passes through it eastward for one and a half furlongs and quits it twenty yards south-west of cairn No. 79; re-entering the reserve the same distance south-east of that cairn it passes eastward through the reserve for two furlongs and joins the Puvalamule path (P.R.W. No. XX) at the point at which that path quits the reserve.

- XIX. Puvalamule – Padiakadu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the west side of cairn No. 135, passes through it in a south-easterly direction, about three furlongs and quits it one hundred yards south-west of cairn No. 89.
- XX. Padumundiakadu – Balebalapu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve fifty yards south-east of cairn No. 138, passes through it in a south-easterly direction for two and half furlongs and quits it one hundred yards west of cairn No. 75.
- XXI. Bepu-Baja foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve fifty yards south of cairn No. 143, passes through it first north-east and then east-south-east for five furlongs and quits it fifty yards west of cairn No. 3 of the Kiriyanadka enclosure; re-entering the reserve twenty yards north of the same cairn, it passes south east through it for one and a half furlongs and finally quits it fifty-five yards north-east of cairn No. 43.
- XXII. Jadikalmule-Mulliar foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred and ten yards south-east of cairn No. 148, passes through it in a generally north-north-westerly direction for about four furlongs and quits it one furlong south-east of cairn No. 8.
- XXIII. Hosagadde-Bepu foot-path, to a width of four feet for men only, enters the reserve one hundred yards north of cairn No. 164 and running east through it for one furlong joins the Tiadka-Mulliar path (P.R.W.No. III).

- XXIV. Path from muli warg No. 26 of Muliari to muli warg No. 37 of the same village to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve two hundred yards west of cairn No. 173, passes through it northward slightly over half a mile crossing the Hiriyanadka bandy-track and quits the reserve two hundred and seventy yards west of cairn No. 3.
- XXV. Hiriyanadka – Kudukoli foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred and fifty yards south of cairn No. 4 of the Hiriyanadka enclosure, passes through it east-south-east for a little over two furlongs and quits it fifty yards north of cairn No. 38.
- XXVI. Hiriyanadka – Kuniari foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve twenty yards north of cairn No. 3 of the Hiriyanadka enclosure, passes through it in a generally southerly direction for four furlongs and quits it thirty yards east of cairn No. 73.
