PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF REVENUE.

READ --the following G.O., dated 15th February, 1884, No. 225, Revenue :--Read-- the following Proceedings of the Board of Revenue, dated 23rd January 1884, No. 225 :--

Read-- the following letter from C. A. GALTON, Esq., Acting Collector of Malabar, to the Secretary to the Board of Revenue (Through the Conservator of Forests, Southern Circle), dated Calicut, 29th December 1883, No.1199; and endorsement by Major I. CAMPBELL WALKER, Conservator of Forests, Southern Circle, dated 10th January 1884:--

I have the honor to forward draft notification under Section 25 of the Madras Forest Act, No.V of 1882, for declaring as reserved forest the Amarampulam and Karimpoya blocks in the Nilambur Division, and request that it may be submitted to Government, together with the accompanying maps.

- 2. The Amarampulam and Karimpoya blocks were purchased from the Amarampulam Rajah in the year 1872-73 for Rs. 80,000. Of this sum, Rs. 10,000 was fixed as the price of a teak plantation (87.44 acres) which was part of the purchase, and Rs.10,000 as the price of the Amarampulam block (386.89 acres), of which all but 65.46 acres were planted up between 1873 and 1876.
- 3. The Karimpoya block cost Rs. 60,000, and consists of 3,945.60 acres, all forest. There is an annual payment of Rs. 100 due as Janmabhogam, but no stump fee of other payments.
- 4. The only rights existing are clearly defined in the deed of sale, and are unimportant, being mainly rights of way, &c. No Settlement Officer is therefore needed, nor any necessity for declaring these blocks under Section 4.

The proposal has the Conservator's concurrence and support. As originally submitted, the covering letter gave no information as to how the forest was acquired and the tenure on which it is held. This want is now supplied by the Collector, and the circumstances appear fully to justify the notification under Section 25 of the Act, as has been done in a similar instance with regard to the Walayar Forest in the Palghat Range of the same district.

2. It is necessary to secure complete control over the plantations, subject only to the rights which are "clearly defined in the deed of sale."
