

NOTIFICATION.

The Elambarakottukunnu Reserved Forest was constituted by notification under Section 18 of the Forest Regulation II of 1068, published in the Travancore Government Gazette dated 3rd July 1900/20th Mithunam 1075. But as the boundaries of the said Reserve have since been surveyed by the Revenue Survey Department and permanently demarcated with cairns, a correct revised description of the boundaries with special reference to cairns is hereto appended for the information of the public.

SITUATION. The reserve is situated about half a furlong to the north of the 5th mile 5th furlong stone of Paripally Madathora road and about 1 1/2 miles to the northeast of the Palhikal market and comprises a portion of S. No. 722 of Madavur Pakuthi.

BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION.

NORTH:—Starting from cairn No. 1 at a village boundary stone on the north east corner of Survey Number 687 of Madavur pakuthi the line runs northward and thence eastward along the village boundary between Chadayamangalam and Madavur and passing cairn numbers 2 to 18 to cairn number 19 about 1/2 chain north of the north east corner of survey number 681.

EAST:—Thence south south west for about 1/2 chain to cairn number 20 at the above mentioned corner; thence skirting survey number 681 and passing cairn numbers 21 to 24 to cairn number 25 at the south west corner of the said survey number; thence west north west for about 4 1/2 chains along the northern side of survey number 683 and passing cairn numbers 26 and 27 to cairn number 28; thence north west for about 4 chains passing cairn numbers 29 and 30 to cairn number 31 on the northern most corner of survey number 685; thence south west for about 1/2 chain to cairn numbers 32; thence south south east for about 4 chains passing cairn number 33 to cairn number 34; thence south east for about 1 1/2 chains to cairn number 35; thence east south east for about 1 chain to cairn number 36; thence south east for about 1 3/4 chains to cairn number 37; thence south west for about 2 chains to cairn number 38 at the western most corner of survey number 676; thence south for about 8 chains along the west side of survey number 675 passing cairn numbers 39 and 40 to cairn number 41 on the north east corner of survey number 722/11; thence skirting survey numbers 722/11, 722/16 again 722/11, and passing cairn numbers 42 to 52 to cairn number 53 on the north west corner of survey number 722/10; thence south for about 7 1/2 chains along the west side of survey number 722/10, 722/9 and 722/12 to cairn number 54; thence east south east for about 2 1/2 chains to cairn number 55; thence south for about 1 1/2 chains to cairn number 56; thence south south west for about 1 1/2 chains to cairn number 57; thence southward for about 9 1/2 chains along the west side of survey numbers 670, 669 and 668 passing cairn numbers 58 to 61 to cairn number 62; thence along the north and west sides of survey number 667 and passing cairn numbers 63 to 65 to cairn No. 66; thence south west for about 1 1/2 chains to cairn number 67; thence west south west for about 7 1/4 chains passing cairn numbers 68 and 69 to cairn number 70; thence north west for about 11 1/4 chains passing cairn number 71 to cairn number 72 at the northernmost corner of survey number 722/17; thence south west for about 5 3/4 chains to cairn number 73 at the western most corner of survey number 722/6; thence south east for about 5 1/4 chains along the south side of the above survey number passing cairn number 74 to cairn number 75; thence south west for about 2 3/4 chains to cairn number 76, thence west north west for about 2 1/4 chains to cairn number 77 thence south south west for about 7 1/2 chains passing cairn numbers 78 and 79 (at Theodolite stations on the west side of survey number 722/18) to cairn number 80; thence south for about 4 chains to cairn number 81, thence east for about 1 1/4 chains to cairn number 82; thence south for about 3 chains along the west side of survey number 722/13 A to cairn number 83; thence south east for about 4 3/4 chains passing cairn number 84 to cairn number 85; thence east south east for about 1 1/2 chains to cairn number 86; thence south east for about 2 1/4 chains to cairn number 87; thence east by slightly south for about 1/2 chain to cairn number 88; thence south by slightly east for about 3 1/2 chains to cairn number 89; thence for about 4 3/4 chains along the west side of survey number 643 passing cairn number 90 to cairn number 91 about a chain north of the south west corner of the above mentioned survey number.

SOUTH:—Thence west south west for about 7 chains passing cairn numbers 92 and 93 to cairn number 94; thence south for about 1/2 chain to cairn number 95; thence south west for about 1 1/2 chains to cairn No. 96, thence south south east for about 3/4 chain to cairn number 97; thence east south-east for about 1/2 chain to cairn number 98; thence south for about 4 chains to cairn number 99; thence south west for 1 3/4 chains to cairn number 100; thence north west for about 9 1/2 chains passing cairn number 101 to cairn number 102; thence south west for about 2 chains to cairn number 103; thence south south west for about 3 chains to cairn number 104; thence west north west for about 11 1/4 chains to cairn number 105; thence north west for about 7 chains along the north side of survey number 897 to cairn number 106.



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West:—Thence northward for about 15½ chains along the east side of survey numbers 699, 700, 704, 705, 713 and passing cairn numbers 107 to 112 to cairn No. 113; thence north west for about 3 chains to cairn number 114; thence north north east for about 2 chains to cairn number 115; thence north for about 2¾ chains to cairn number 116; thence north east for about 2 chains to cairn number 117; thence north north west for about 2 1½ chains to cairn number 118; thence north west for about 1¾ chains to cairn number 119; thence west north west for about 2 1¼ chains to cairn No. 120; thence west south west for about 1 chain to cairn No. 121; thence north north west for about 1 chain to cairn No. 122; thence west north west for about 1 chain to cairn No. 123; thence north west for about 7 chains passing cairn Nos. 124 and 125 to cairn No. 126 at the northern most corner of survey No. 721; thence south west for about 2¾ chains to cairn No. 127; thence north north west for about 2¾ chains to cairn No. 128; thence west south west for about 2 1½ chains to cairn No. 129; thence north west for about 1 1¼ chains to cairn No. 130; thence north by slightly west for about 1 chain to cairn No. 131; thence north west for about 2 chains to cairn No. 132; thence north north west for about 2 chains to cairn No. 133; (the line from cairn No. 129 to 133 runs along the eastern limits of survey Nos. 727, 726 and 725) thence north east for about 1 1¼ chains to cairn number 134; thence north for about 1½ chain to cairn No. 135; thence north north west for about 2 chains to cairn No. 136; thence north north east for about 1¾ chains to cairn No. 137; thence north by slightly west for about 1¼ chain to cairn No. 138; thence north east for about 2 1½ chains to cairn number 139; thence north by slightly east for about 3¾ chains to cairn No. 140 (the line from cairn No. 135 to 140 runs along the eastern limit of survey Nos. 724 and 723) thence east south east for about 1 1¼ chains to cairn number 141; thence south by slightly east for about 2 1¼ chains passing cairn numbers 142 and 143 to cairn number 144; thence east north east for about 1¼ chains passing cairn number 145 to cairn number 146; thence north east for about 1 1¼ chains to cairn number 147; thence north by slightly west for about 2 chains passing cairn number 141 to cairn number 149; thence north east for about 1 1½ chains to cairn number 150; thence north north west for about 2 chains to cairn number 151; thence west north west for about 1 chain to cairn number 152 (the line from cairn number 141 to 152 skirts the survey numbers 695, 694 and 693); thence north east for about 2 1½ chains to cairn number 153; thence east north east for about 4 1¼ chains to cairn number 154; thence east south east for about 5 chains passing cairn number 155 to cairn number 156; thence south south east for about 1 1½ chains to cairn number 157; thence east south east for about 11 1¼ chains passing cairn numbers 158 to 160 to cairn number 161; thence south south east for about 3 1½ chains passing cairn number 162 to cairn number 163; thence south east for about 3 1½ chains to cairn number 164; thence skirting survey number 722/13 B passing cairn numbers 165 to 174 to cairn number 175 about a chain west of its north west corner; thence north west for about 2 1¼ chains to cairn number 176; thence north north west for about 2¾ chains to cairn number 177; thence north west for about 19 chains passing cairn numbers 178 to 183 to cairn number 184; thence west for about 3 chains to cairn number 185; thence north north west for about 3 1¼ chains to cairn number 186; thence north north east for about 4¾ chains along the village boundary between Pallikal and Madavur and passing cairn numbers 187 to cairn number 188 at a village boundary stone; thence south east for about 5 chains passing cairn number 189 to cairn number 190; thence south south east for about 1 chain to cairn number 191; thence north east for about 1½ chain to cairn number 192; thence south east for about 2¾ chains to cairn number 193; thence east north east for about 1¾ chain to cairn number 194; thence north north east for about ¾ chain to cairn number 195; thence north north west for about 3¾ chains passing cairn number 196 to cairn number 197; thence north for about 3 1¼ chains to cairn number 1 at the starting point on the north boundary.

#### PRIVATE RIGHTS WITHIN THE RESERVE.

##### I. LANDS.

There are no such rights now as the lands comprised in survey numbers 696 to 698 known as "Kuttampatcha" enclosure along with survey number 722/13 b and the temple and kavu with their premises to the south east of survey number 688 have been thrown out of the Reserve by an alteration of the outer boundary and as the registered holding in survey number 722/7 within the reserve has been included in the reserve by an exchange of land given from survey number 899 excluded from the reserve as per Government order No. 3107/L. R. & F., dated 31st March 1914.

*Note:* Government direct under Section 20 of the Forest Regulation that the lands mentioned above as having been excluded from the reserve shall cease to be reserved from the date of publication of this notification.

#### PUBLIC RIGHTS WITHIN THE RESERVE.

##### II. RIGHTS OF WAY.

The right to use by men and cattle of (1) a foot path 3 ft. wide, which enters the reserve about a chain to the east of cairn number 12 on the outer boundary of the reserve and after running in a south easterly direction for about 13 chains, thence east south east for about 3 chains and thence south east for about 9 chains, leaves the reserve near cairn number 46 on the boundary (2) and another foot path, 3 ft. wide which enters the reserve at cairn number 193 and after running in a southerly direction for about 2 1½ chains and thence south east for about 4 1½ chains leaves the reserve at cairn number 180. The same path enters the reserve again near cairn number 172 and after running in a south easterly direction for about 7 1½ chains and thence in a south south easterly direction for about 5 1½ chains leaves the reserve between cairn numbers 72 and 73 on the outer boundary.
